

Activities done by students range from, photo booths, decorating t-shirts, creating large displays, and even peer to peer presentations. In North Dakota 11.7% of youth smoke commercial tobacco. According to Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids, 14,000 kids now under the age of 18 will ultimately die prematurely from smoking. This year the following schools participated in Great American Smokeout: Horizon Middle School, Simle Middle School, Legacy High School, Century High School, Light of Christ 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Academy, and St. Mary's High School.
