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## Corrective Statements From the Tobacco Industry: More Evidence for Why We Need Effective Tobacco Control.

In 2006 the U.S. Department of Justice ruled against the tobacco industry under the Racketeering Influenced and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) Act. As a part of this ruling, Big Tobacco companies were ordered to make corrective statements about the adverse health effects of smoking. Now, almost **11 years** later those statements are FINALLY making their debut to the American people.

- No health benefit from smoking "low tar," "light," "ultra light," "mild," and "natural" cigarettes
- •Tobacco companies' manipulation of cigarette design and composition to enhance nicotine delivery
- •Adverse health effects of exposure to secondhand smoke.
