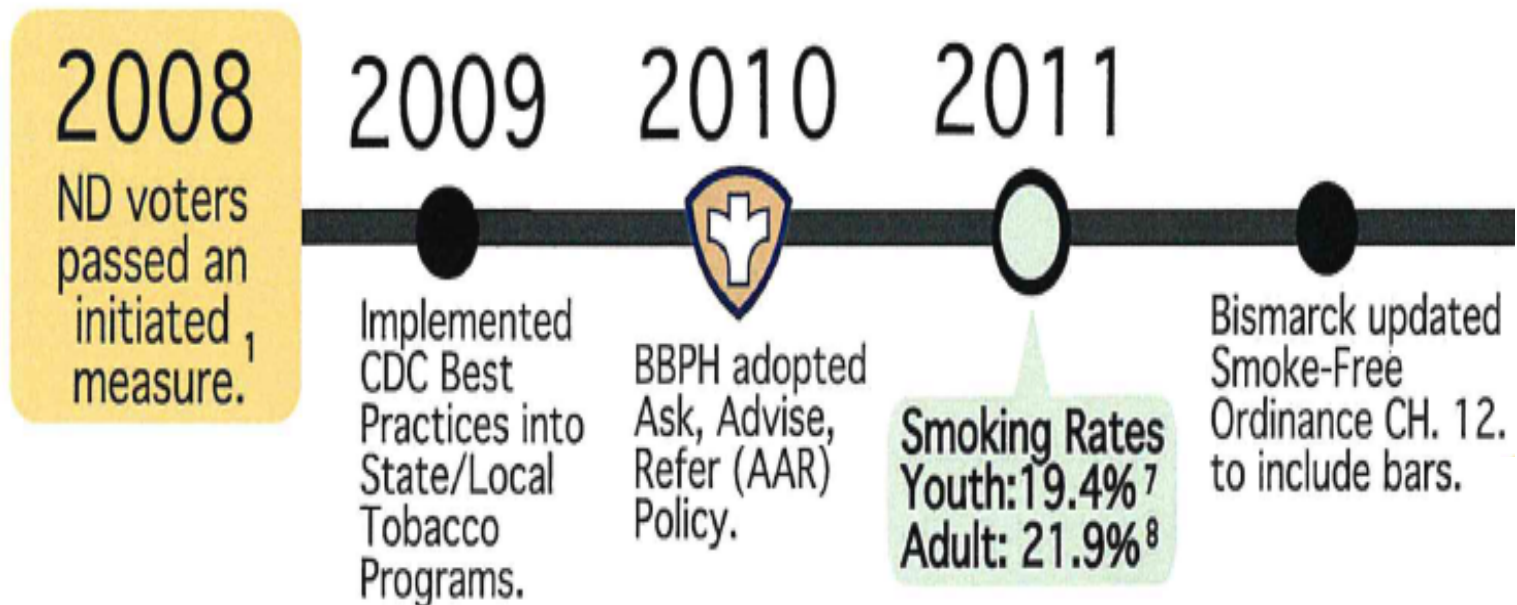

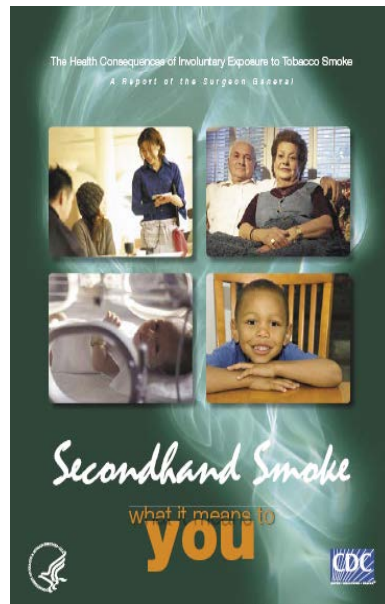




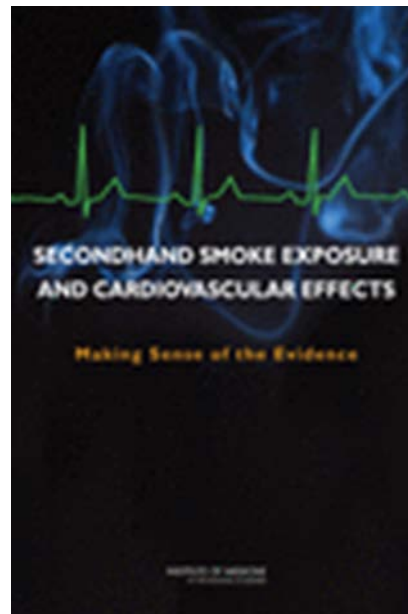
2008 Initiated Measure #3

- Passed by North Dakota voters in November of 2008
- Established a tobacco prevention and control advisory committee to develop and fund a statewide tobacco prevention and control plan
- Dollars are from Strategic Contribution Fund
- \$9.3 million per year will be spent on a CDC approved comprehensive programs

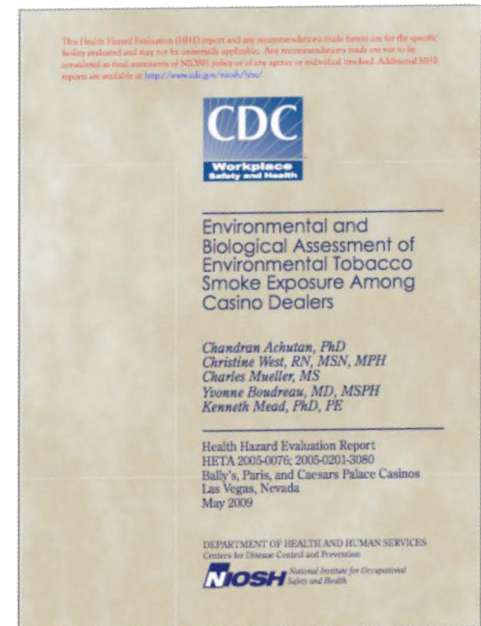

City Commission passes smoking ban by 4-1 vote

Lighting up in Bismarck has become illegal Nov. 1.

City commissioners on Tuesday backed smoking in all pubs, smoke houses and truck stops with a 4-1 vote.

Commissioner Mike Seminary opposed the new law on the grounds it impinged people's right to choose.

The controversy drew 225 spectators to the Civic Center Ballroom Hall. Two very polarized sides of the audience were each given 30 minutes to speak.

The medical community came out in full force in favor of the smoking ban as did several spokespersons of the Bismarck Tobacco Free Coalition.

Dr. Steven Haines, a Mid Dakota Clinic physician and surgeon, said some 100 studies have been done about secondhand smoke. "They all show that second-hand smoke causes heart





Smoke-Free Bismarck Message: 2011

- Smokers remain welcome everywhere, just not the smoke
- All employees deserve safe working environments
- 72% of Bismarck voters favor a citywide smoke-free workplace law
- 89% Bismarck voters believe that hospitality establishments would be healthier for customers and employees if they were smoke-free.
- Going smoke-free is a good business decision

Special Election April 19th 2011

The special election was held April 19, 2011. The election brought a record number of voters with close to 9000 Bismarck residents coming to the polls. 60% of voters opted to keep the smoke free ordinance in place. Voters also rejected the idea of smoking

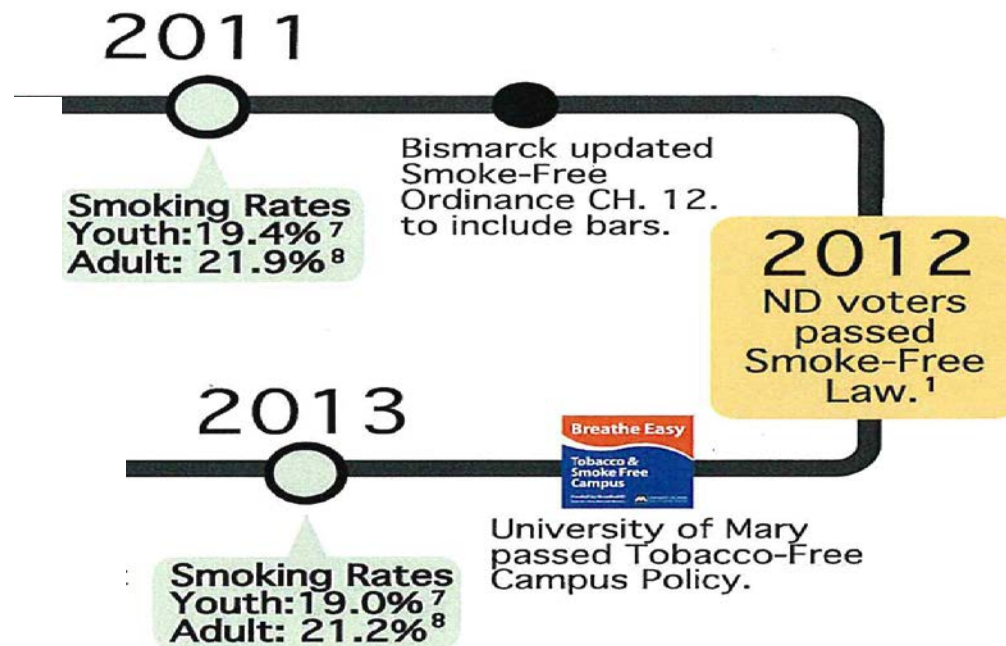

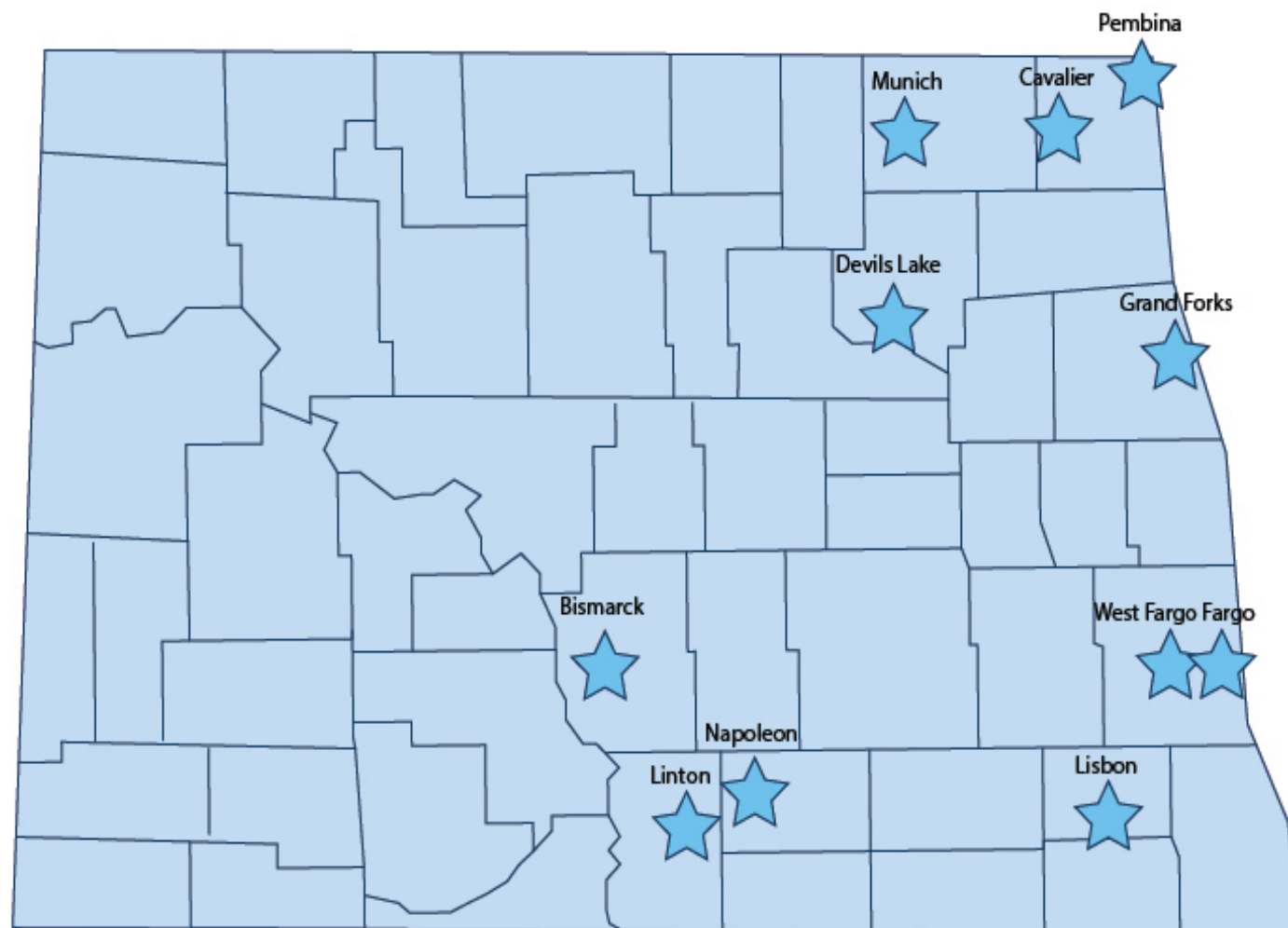

ND Smoke Free Law

On November 6, 2012, every county in the state voted in favor of becoming smoke-free. The law advances public health by protecting more workers, residents and visitors from secondhand smoke exposure in public places and places of employment.

What To Know About North Dakota's Smoke Free Law

NDCC 23-12-09-23-12-11

- ✓ No smoking, vaping, or e-cigarette use in indoor areas where smoking is prohibited and within 20 feet of entrances, exits, operable windows, air intakes, and ventilation systems of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited.



- ✓ Remove ashtrays from any area where smoking is prohibited, including 20 feet from entrances, exits, operable windows, air intakes and ventilation systems.
- ✓ Post "No Smoking" signs clearly and conspicuously at all entrances.
- ✓ Post "No Smoking" signs in the places where smoking is prohibited.

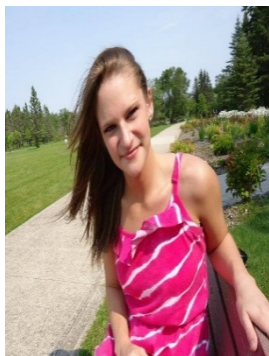

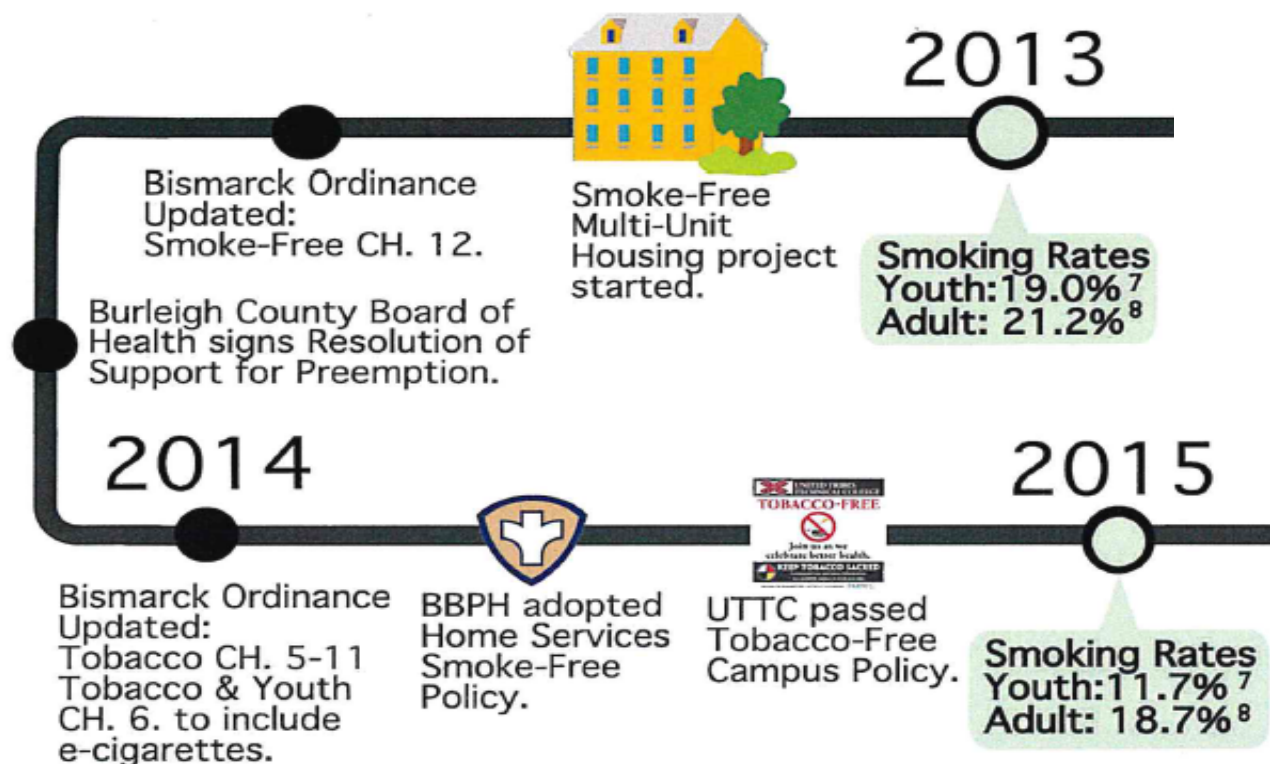

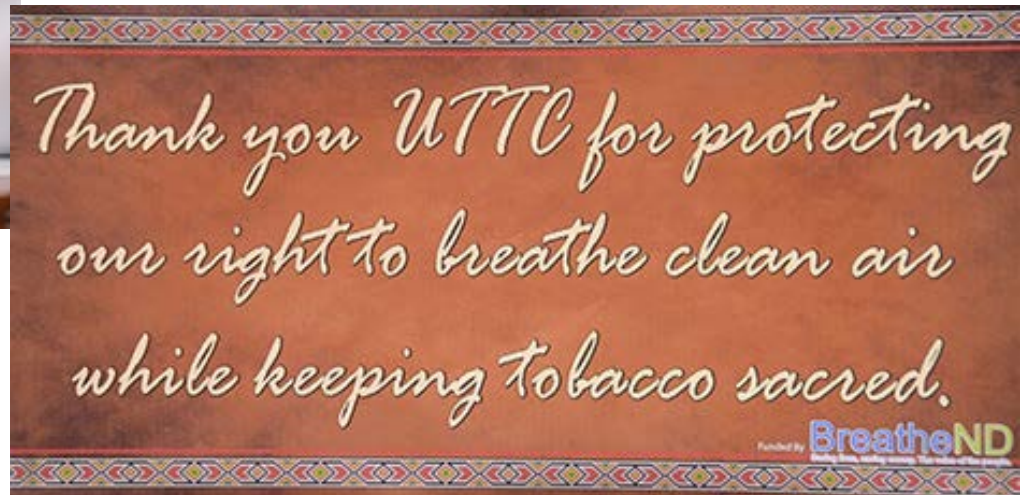

Economic Evaluation of Smoke Free Policies

The study includes sales tax data from Bismarck and Mandan bars and restaurants from the first quarter of 2004 through the fourth quarter 2012.

The results follow the national trend of revenue after a smoke free law is passed – no significant impact on overall restaurant or bar revenue was found.

Bismarck restricts e-cigarette sales to minors

On February 11, the Bismarck City Commission heard testimony from area youth and Bismarck Tobacco Free Board Members on the need for a local ordinance addressing a legal age for possession and sale of electronic cigarettes.

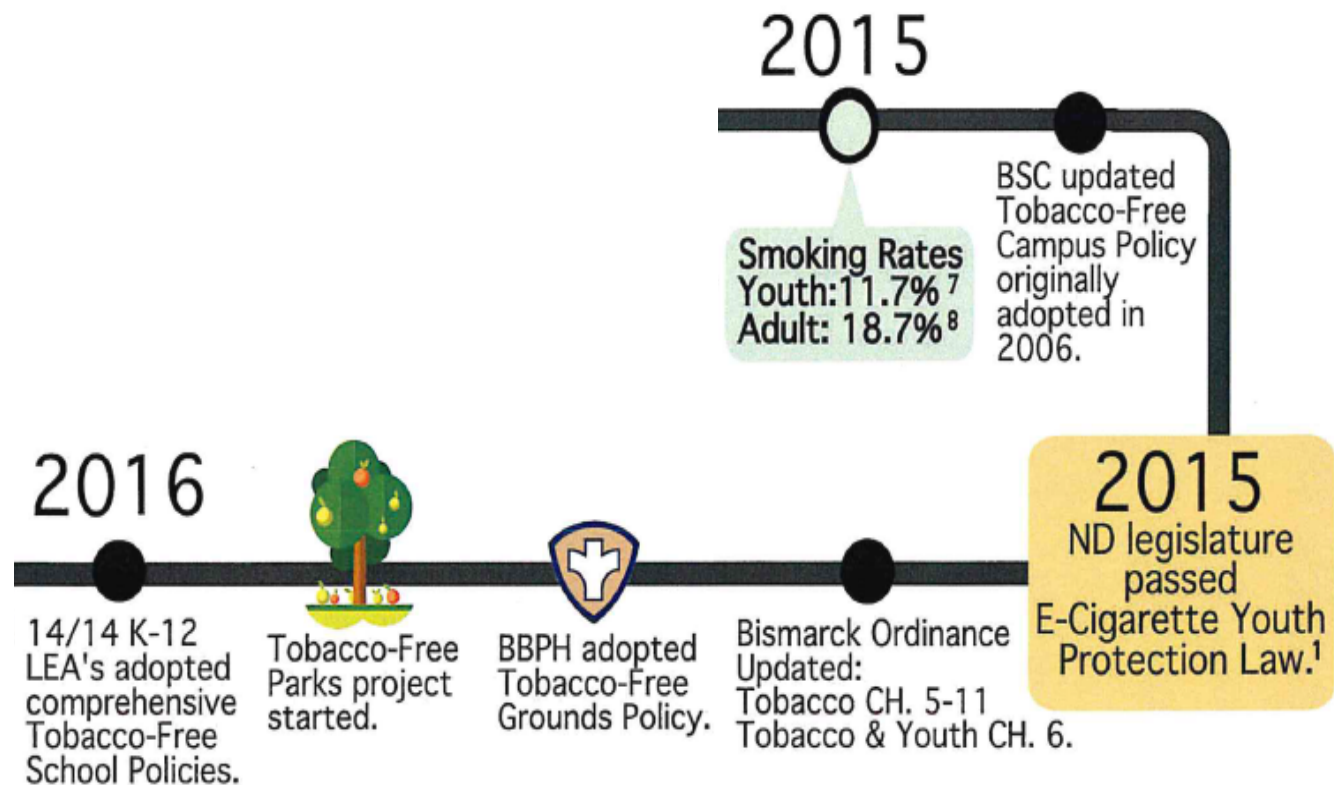

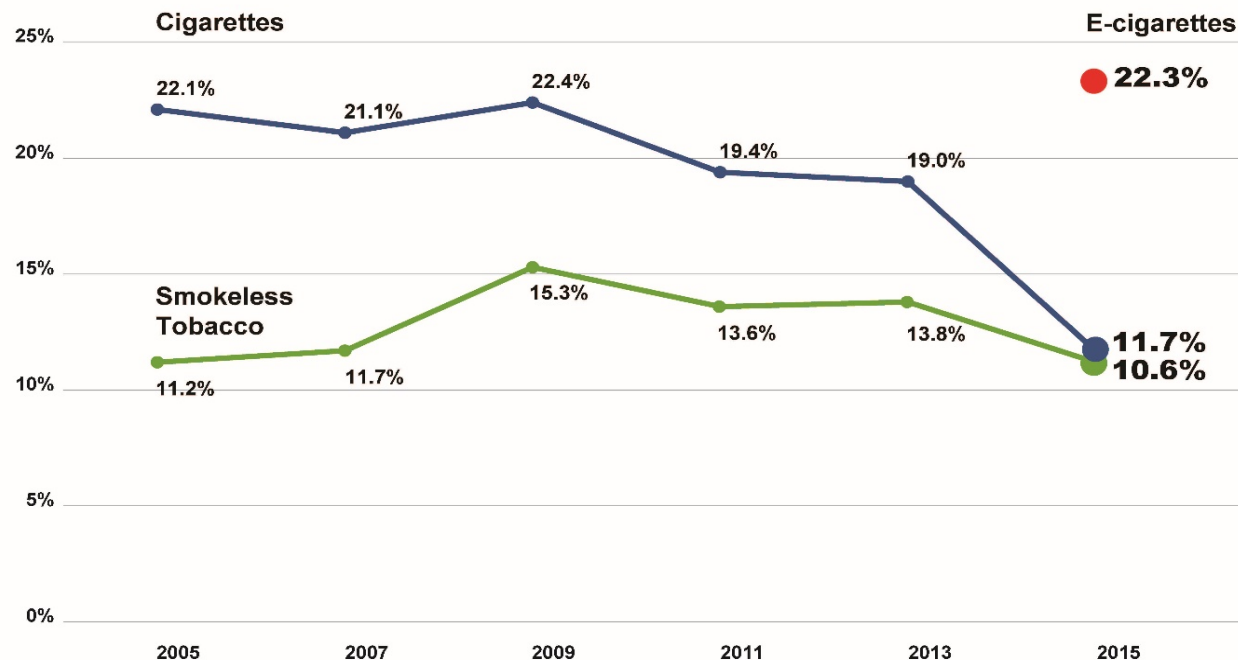

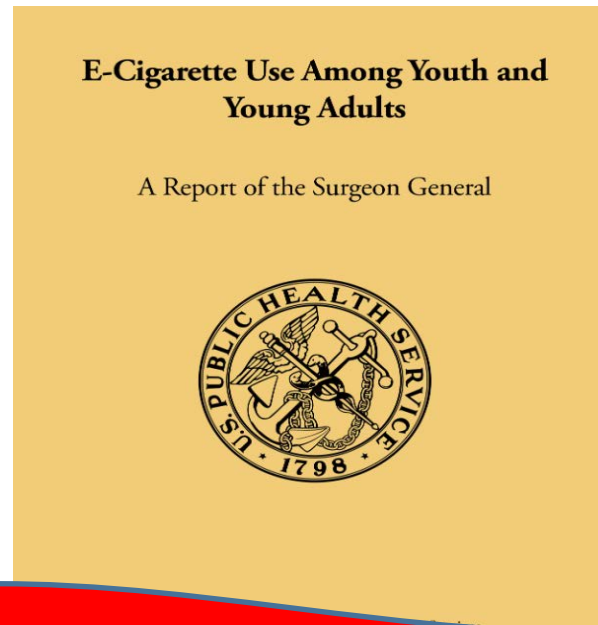
Updated: City of Bismarck Ordinance Chapter 5-11 & Chapter 6

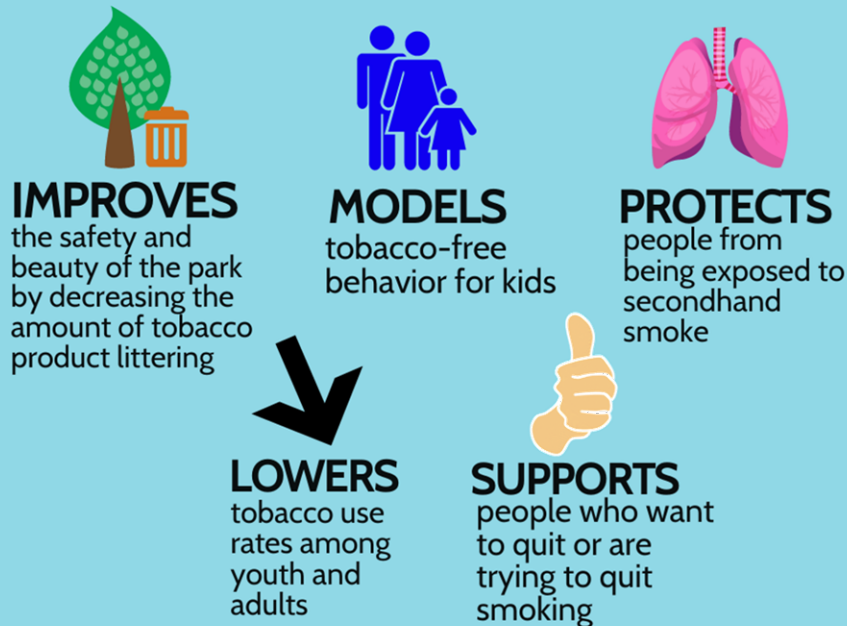
